We are on a mission; God's mission of bringing love, healing and peace into a broken and suffering world. May it be so.

Faith Matters: Tough Questions

What do we explore on Sunday mornings as we work our way through Shane Claiborne's "Jesus For President"? Here's an example:

In the last few hundred years, the average person's life has become dizzyingly complicated. Even the seemingly simple act of drinking a cup of coffee involves an intricate international system of bean pickers, international shipping (fueled by oil from who knows where), packaging (in what?), roasting (by energy from who knows where), domestic shipping, driving to get it (using car parts and gas from around the world), and so on. It's like the cup of coffee has been dragged halfway across the earth, leaving trench-like trail marks along the way.

Examples of God's Kingdom colliding with empire are all around. Yes, we can talk about what "they" should do. But hopefully our discussions push on to who we are as Christians, what we can do, and what I will do.

You are invited to join the conversation: **Sunday mornings at 9:15am** during the Education Hour. Coffee and tea -- for both enjoyment and as reminders of our tough questions -- are offered.

Church Council News



The Church Council held its monthly meeting on September 19. The Council discussed outdoor signage for the “Just Breathe” contemplation gatherings that are held every Wednesday from 7:00 to 7:30 p.m. The Council also unanimously approved a motion to set up a separate bank account for the new unit of the Women of the ELCA that is being formed at Good Shepherd.

Danny Patrick, our Building Rental Coordinator, announced that Huskie’s Heroes will be using the Blue Room on Monday and Wednesday evenings. This long-term agreement was approved by the Council in August.

The members of a Special Committee (Kathy Crouse, Carol Phelps, Joan Walker and Marjorie Raymond) have reviewed and updated our membership roll.
