## Journeying through Lent

We have quickly moved through the season of Advent to Christmas, then to Epiphany, and soon to the season of Lent. Wednesday, February 14, 2018 – yes Valentine’s Day – is also Ash Wednesday. It marks the beginning of Lent, a season in the church year that is especially meaningful to me. I’ve always really enjoyed Lent, not because I enjoy fasting or giving up things, but as a time to deeply reflect on my relationship with God. That is, after all, what Lent is all about. One of my favorite authors, Henry Nouwen, gives a beautiful definition of Lent through the following prayer:

“How often have I lived through these weeks without paying much attention to penance, fasting, and prayer? How often have I missed the spiritual fruits of the season without even being aware of it? But how can I ever really celebrate Easter without observing Lent? How can I rejoice fully in your Resurrection when I have avoided participating in your death? Yes, Lord, I have to die—with you, through you, and in you—and thus become ready to recognize you when you appear to me in your Resurrection. There is so much in me that needs to die: false attachments, greed and anger, impatience and stinginess.... I see clearly now how little I have died with you, really gone your way and been faithful to it. O Lord, make this Lenten season different from the other ones. Let me find you again. Amen.”  
(From *A Cry for Mercy: Prayers from the Genesee*, *Orbis*)

This prayers from Nouwen, truly touches on the heart of Lent. It is – above all else – a season to draw closer to God by removing from our lives those things that get in the way of our relationship with God. It’s so tempting to avoid serious self-reflection and contemplating on Jesus’ suffering and death during Lent because it can be painful, yet as Nouwen so eloquently states, “How can I rejoice fully in your Resurrection when I have avoided participating in your death?”

May our journey through the 40 days of Lent this year be truly different from any in our past as we open ourselves to prayer, and invite the Holy Spirit to renew us. Then, on Easter morning we will truly celebrate the joy of the Resurrection!



## Church Council News

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At the January 2018 meeting, Jeff Emptage provided information about pledges and contributions for the “Faith Works” program. The balance on the Mission Investment Loan Fund was \$30,623.33 as of December 31, 2017. The Council has recommended that congregation approve the proposal from the Finance Team to pay off the loan, using funds from the Marilyn Morris bequest.

The Church Council also discussed the proposal from the Property Team to use funds from the Marilyn Morris bequest to replace flooring and make other improvements in the Fellowship Room. The Council has recommended that the congregation approve the proposal at the congregational meeting.

Immediately following the Annual Meeting on January 28, the Council members will elect officers for 2018 and appoint the Assistant Treasurer, the Financial Secretary and the Assistant Financial Secretary. The Installation of Council members will take place on Sunday, February 4, at the 8:00 a.m. service.

At the meeting on February 13, the Council will appoint Committee Chairs, Team Leads and other positions for 2018, elect one person for the Audit Committee, and elect two voting members for the Hillenbrandt Scholarship Committee.
